Brief Profile

SARJIT S. GILL is a Professor of Social Anthropology at the Department of Social and Development Sciences, Faculty of Human Ecology, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM). He obtained his PhD (2005), MA (1999) and BA (1998) in Anthropology & Sociology from the Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM).

Since joining the academic staff of UPM in 2000, he has nurtured and developed his research interest and core expertise primarily in minority studies, specializing in the Sikh community of Malaysia. Over the years, he has extended his interest on minority studies by studying other ethnic minority communities in the country, including Orang Asli (indigenous groups) in Peninsular Malaysia and selected native groups in Sabah and Sarawak. The main thrust of his expertise is social development of minority communities in Malaysia. In doing so, he has established himself as one of the leading experts in minority studies, a highly relevant and critical field in multi-ethnic societies such as Malaysia to ensure social cohesion and inclusive development. This is in keeping with the cutting edge knowledge in the field, and also with social policies of inclusive and sustainable development as articulated in the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 2030.

As expression of his expertise, Sarjit lectures in Sociology and Social Anthropology; Social Policy and Planning; Society, Development and Environment; Social Change and Community Development. Sarjit adapts his teaching so as to be congruent with fieldwork approaches. To date, he has successfully graduated 31 postgraduate students (17 as main supervisor) and 62 undergraduate students (as Final Year Project supervisor).

He also acted as internal/external examiner to 50 PhD and 38 Master thesis candidates from universities in Malaysia, United Kingdom, India and Brunei. Sarjit's active research and consultancy initiatives earned 27 grants (17 as principal investigator) amounting to RM1.9 million from local, private and international fund providers. Sarjit has conducted research among ethnic minorities in Malaysia and published numerous peer reviewed scientific papers and book chapters on issues of digital divide, consumerism and identity crisis in Malaysia since 2005. In publication, he has more than 80 journal papers in cited and referred journal, 10 books, 46 chapters in book, 25 proceedings, six modules and 62 popular writings (magazine and newspapers). To date, Sarjit has 5 Scopus H Index, (98 citations) and 14 Google H Index (1040 citations). At international level, Sarjit has presented papers that include keynote addresses in conferences in USA, Australia, Singapore, Thailand and Indonesia. He had also acted as visiting scholar at Walailak University, Thailand.

As an anthropologist, Dr. Sarjit has considerable strength in the application of qualitative methods of data collection, analyses and report writing. He has also conducted several training and academic workshops in qualitative methodologies in National Institute of Public Administration (INTAN) and the National Museum of Malaysia. With such expertise and contribution, Sarjit has built a fine reputation and earned the respect in the academic and policy circles, as well as among civil society groups. He has in fact been given the trust to deliver four keynote addresses in national and international conferences. He has been a voice of conscience upholding social justice and unity in particular for ethnic minorities in Malaysia throughout his academic career and advocacy work.

With such fine reputation and respect, he is often referred to by various circles nationally and internationally. For example, he has strong networks with international counterparts in Indonesia, Australia, Thailand and Singapore, he was chosen to represent Malaysia on three occasions; Peace and Human Security Workshop organized by UNESCO in Bangkok, Thailand (2007), the Interfaith Conference in Perth, Australia (2009) and the Interfaith Summit in Bali, Indonesia (2012). Currently, he is Vice President for Asia Pacific Forum on Ethics and Social Justice (Malaysia). At the national level, Sarjit was involved as expert reference to revise the new Malaysia Youth Policy under the Ministry of Youth and Sports Malaysia. He is a member of the Malaysian Institute of Integrity; executive editor for the Malaysian Journal of Youth Studies, and think-tank member of Malaysian Institute for Research in Youth Development, Ministry of Youth and Sports Malaysia.

Sarjit has also been referred to by various ministries, agencies, local communities, and special interest groups. He served as a Guest Writer (Karyawan Tamu) Ministry of Higher Education; Chairman of the Social Harmony Cluster, Youth Development Research Institute Malaysia (IPPBM), Ministry of Youth and Sports Malaysia; Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Journal of Technical and Social Sciences, Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Polytechnic, Selangor, as a member of the Task Force to review the Report of National Inquiry into the Land Rights of Indigenous Peoples by SUHAKAM; former Secretary of the National Unity Cluster of National Professors Council, Prime Minister's Department; Member of the Advisory Board of the Institute of National Integration and Training (IKLIN), Department of National Unity and National Integration, Department of the Prime Minister; and former Deputy Chairman of the Executive Committee on Religious Issues, the Committee to Promote Understanding and Harmony among Religions (JKMPKA) for two years. In 2016, the Vice-Chancellor of Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) appointed Sarjit as a member of Independent Experts on Indian Civilization to help resolve the controversy involving the presentation of slides on Indian Civilization, in Islamic Civilization and Asian Civilization Course (TITAS) at Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM). In early 2020, the Department of Higher Education Malaysia (JPT) appointed Sarjit as a member of Independent Experts on Ethnic Relations to investigate the controversial final examination questions on Ethnic Relations course at Universiti Malaysia Perlis (UniMAP).

His academic standing, strong leadership qualities and effective soft skills have been much sought after, and have been tapped into for the advantage of UPM. He was given the opportunity to hold several administrative posts including Program Head, Community Education Research, Institute for Social Science Studies; and as Head of the Department of Social and Development Sciences, Faculty of Human Ecology. He also served as Deputy President for UPM Academic Staff Association. He also served as member of Research and Publications Committee, Industrial Training Committee, Professional Services Committee and presently as a trainer for Popular Writing and Media Engagement program under Centre for Academic Development (CADe).

He is a life member of the Malaysian Social Sciences Association (PSSM), several Editors Board Members including Asian People Journal published by University Sultan Zainal Abidin (UniSZA), Jurnal Kinabalu published by Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS). Sarjit is also a Member of American Anthropological Association, Member for Malaysian Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society, and former Supreme Council Member for Malaysian Youth Council (MBM).

In terms of public engagement, Sarjit has employed his presentation skills to give talks in more than 200 programs, benefiting thousands. Sarjit features regularly in the media such as RTM, TV3, TV9, Astro Awani, Al-Hijrah, Bernama TV, Radio24 and RTM Radio to share his views on

Malaysian society, especially on minorities' issues. His outstanding achievement in media engagement earned him the UPM Media Personality Award in 2009. He has been writing regularly in various professional magazines published by Institute of Language and Literature (Dewan Bahasa & Pustaka) since 1999, and was awarded Anugerah Citra Sahabat by DBP in recognition of his work on the promotion of the Malay language in Malaysia.

Sarjit's expertise in minority studies in Malaysia in particular and his contribution to the academic field as well as to the country's policies on social development and his engagement with the public indicate clearly that he has the 3Rs (Relevance, Respected and Referred) and that he is an asset to Malaysia and Universiti Putra Malaysia.
