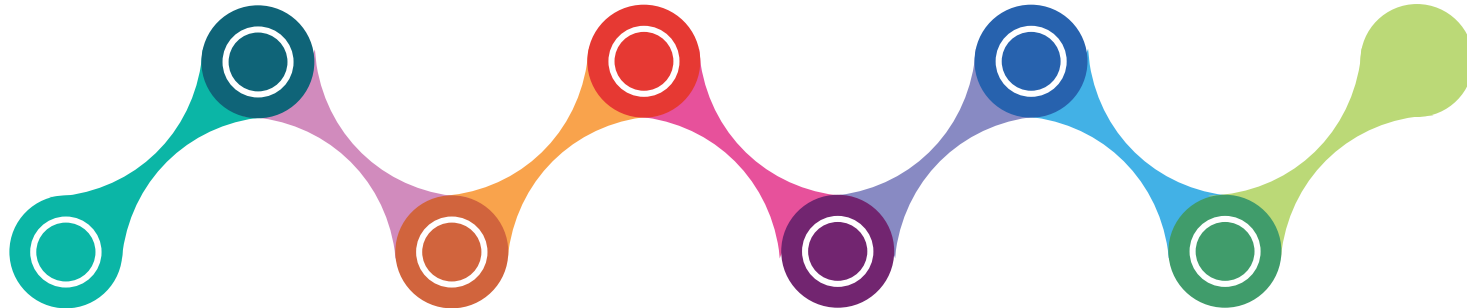

One (1) credit hour Seminar Research Proposal (SPS5903). Must register not later than second (2nd) semester. Fail to register or fail on second attempt will result in "Termination"



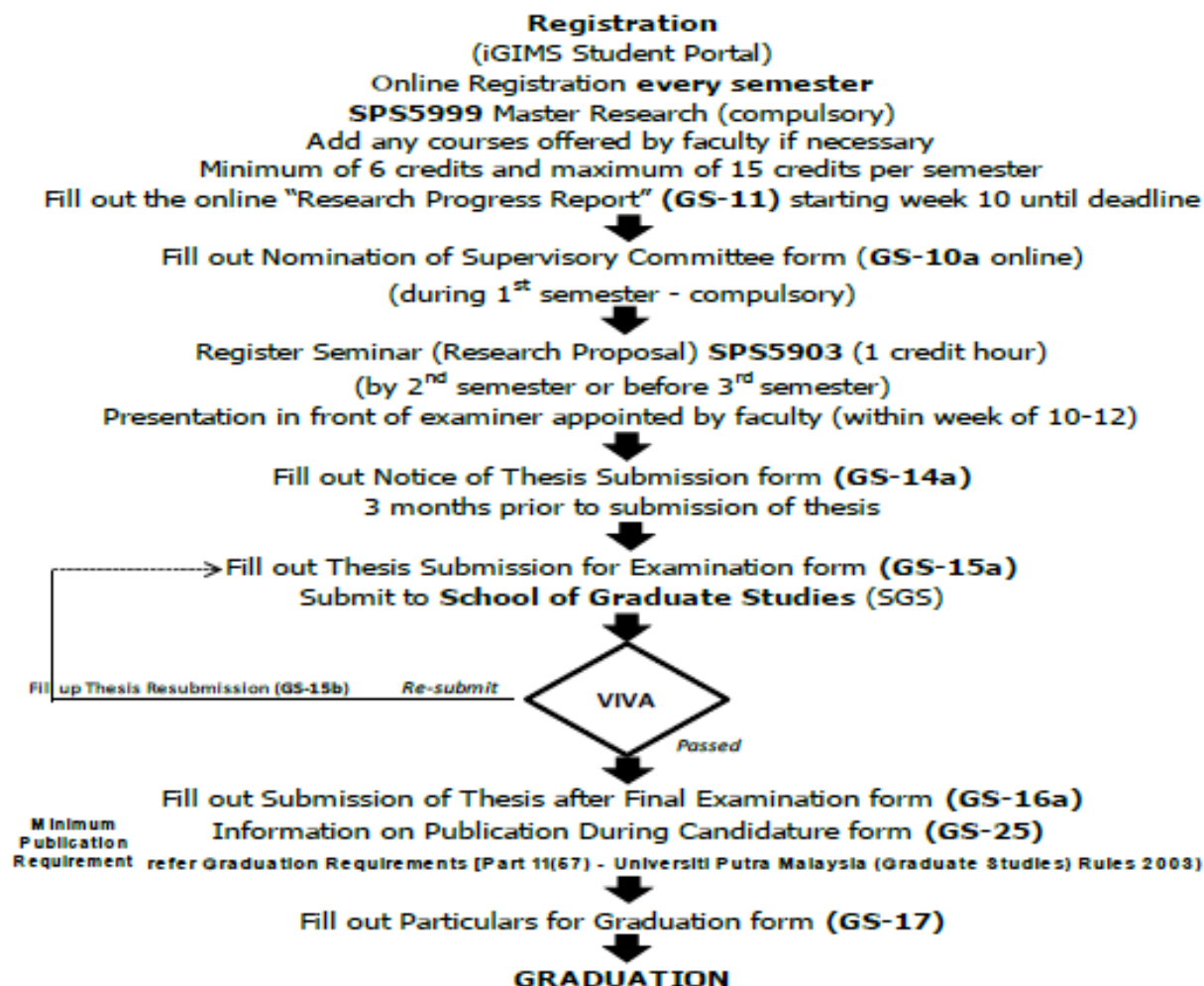
At least one (1) research methodology course

Comply to the minimum publication requirement

Under the supervision of a supervisory committee which comprises **a chairman and at least one (1) other member**. Nomination can be made starting at the end of the 1st semester – before the end of 2nd semester using form GS10a.

Failure to nominate the supervisory committee by second semester will lead to a **SUSPENDED** status.

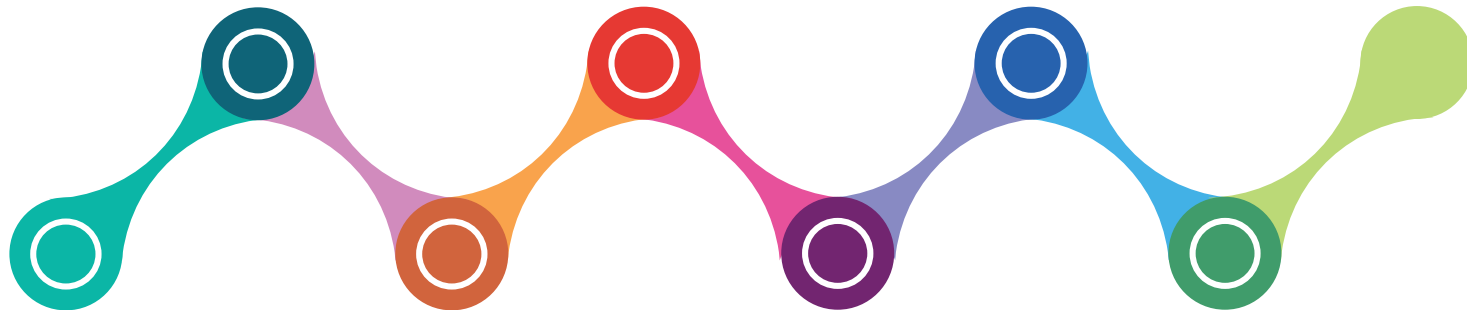

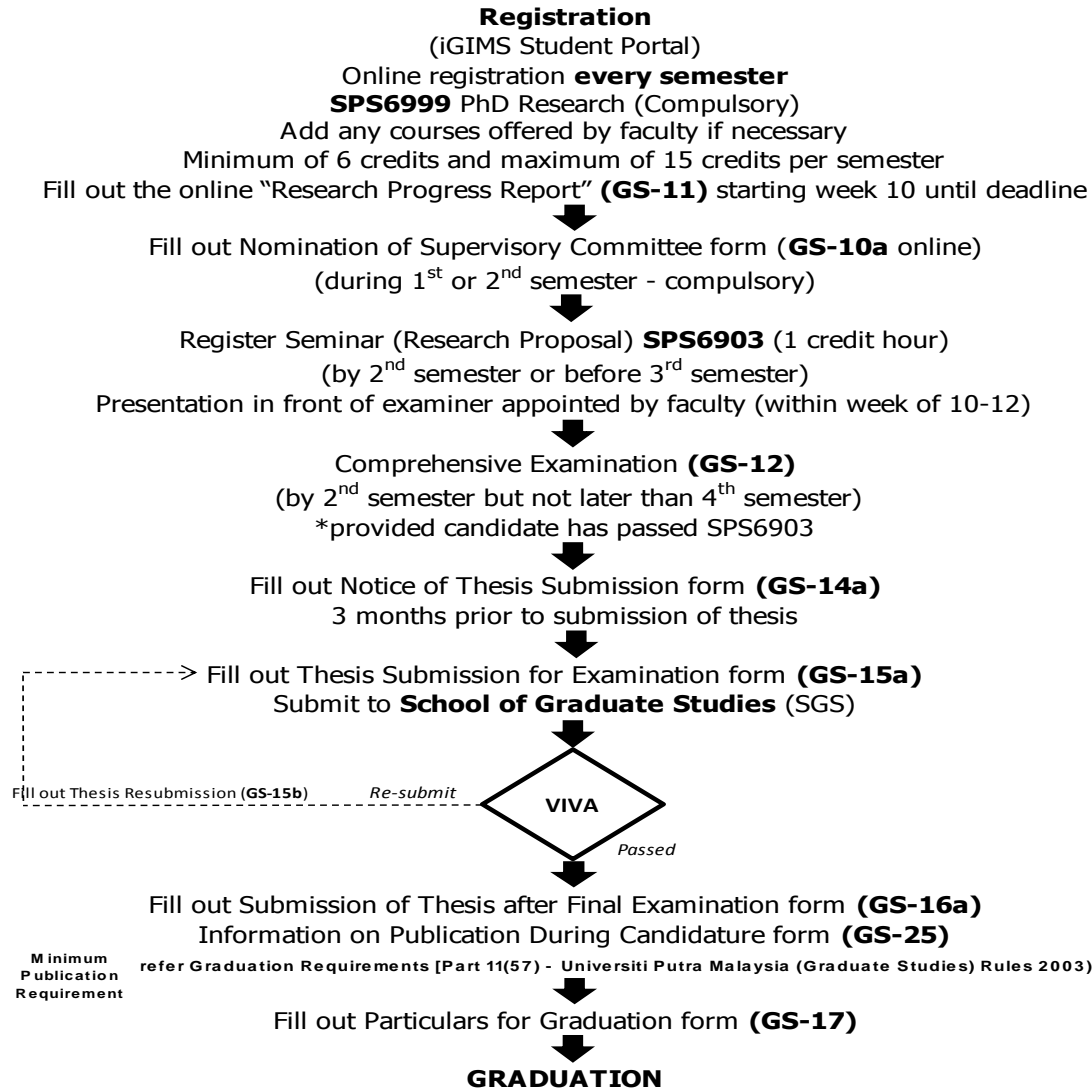

All students in degree programmes by research must show proof of having published or submitted journal articles based on research conducted during their candidature prior to graduation as follows:

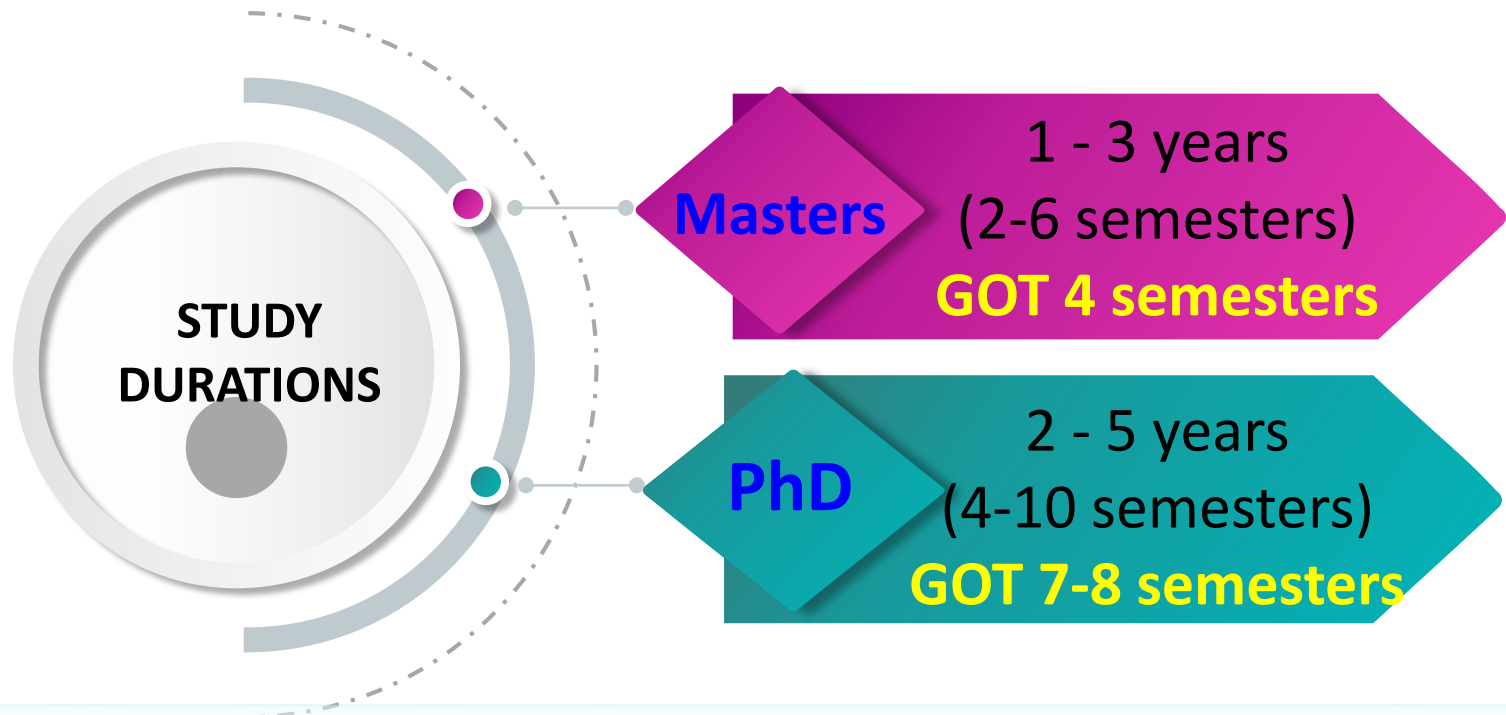

- ☐ A book chapter is considered as being equivalent to one CIJ journal article.
- ☐ A student who has filed for a patent based on research conducted during his candidature may apply in writing to the Dean of School of Graduate Studies for exemption. **One patent is equivalent to one journal article.**

# IMPORTANT



## Credit Exemption

- May apply base on relevant graduate level courses taken at recognized university/institution **within the last five (5) years**
- If eligible **must apply in the first (1<sup>st</sup>) semester**

## International Students

- Register and pass Postgraduate Intensive English (PIE) 2 within the first two (2) consecutive semesters

## Late Registration (during candidature)

- Permitted up to **second (2<sup>nd</sup>) weeks** of a semester
- Late registration fee **RM100.00** will be charged
- Failing to register or pay full fee by beginning of the **third (3<sup>rd</sup>) weeks** of the semester, shall be automatically dropped
- Reinstatement fee amounting of **RM600.00** will be imposed, if the appeal is approved

## SPS5999 for Masters and SPS6999 for PhD

- Must register **every semester** until thesis submission
- If not, cannot fill **GS-11**
- **Fill out GS-11 online latest by last day of the examination or else RM100.00 penalty will be charged afterwards**

## Deferment

- May defer **not more than two (2) semesters**
- Deferment must be applied in **the first seventh (7<sup>th</sup>) weeks of the semester**
- May withdraw any time. Cannot reverse and need to apply as new student
- **Penalty of RM600.00 is charged** if deferment or withdrawal made after second (2<sup>nd</sup>) weeks but before seventh (7<sup>th</sup>) weeks of the semester
- Not more than three (3) semesters
- With acceptable justifications
- Application not more than twice
